Brief course description:

Certificate in Teaching English as a Foreign Language (CertTEFL) Level 5 is a new qualification specifically designed to develop the skills required for people wishing to embark on a career as an EFL (English as a Foreign Language) teacher. It is designed for people with little or no knowledge of teaching EFL. CertTEFL is a practical course for those who wish to start a career in teaching EFL.

The EDI CertTEFL Level 5 qualification which is accredited by the UK Regulatory Authority will help you developed the following key skills:

- Understand the essential aspects of an EFL teacher's role
- Organise and manage effective learning
- Develop professionally through ongoing reflection and evaluation
- Gain valuable presentation skills
- Understand the structure of the English language

You can take the CertTEFL Level 5 full-time (typically four to five weeks), or part-time (from a few months to over a year).

Details:

The EDI CertTEFL Level 5 programme has 5 compulsory modules:

- Learners and teachers, and the teaching and learning context
- Language analysis and awareness
- Language skills: reading, listening, speaking and writing
- Planning and resources for different teaching contexts
- Developing teaching skills and professionalism

Methodology:

The EDI CertTEFL Level 5 is delivered through a combination:

- Theory through input sessions
- Practice through teaching practice sessions and assignments

Assessment:

The EDI CertTEFL Level 5 is assessed via a combination of teaching practice, teacher observation and written assignments. Candidate performance is internally assessed by course tutors and externally moderated by EDI examiners. Assessment consists of:

- Observation of experienced teachers within the learning environment
- Delivery of monitored teaching practice classes
- Demonstration of learning through written assignments
- Candidates are required to keep portfolios of all work
